How to Pay Local (City) Taxes

The city taxes are to be paid by all taxpayers within the fixed payment period. Please cooperate in making payment within the time limit.

Payment Methods

Local (City) Taxes can be paid in person at a financial institution or the city hall by the deadline.

In addition, you can set up an automatic account transfer (*kouza furikae*) at your bank that automatically withdraws the money and transfers on the due date for payment.

Local (City) Taxes can also be paid at convenience stores, and this tax can be paid at any time from convenience stores nationwide.

Japan Post Bank and post offices in the Kanto and Yamanashi Prefectures also process payments.

*Payment in advance means to pay the full amount of taxation for 1 ~ 4 tax periods by the due date for payment for 1 tax period.

If you receive a tax notice from Kasama city, you can pay at the following places.

1. Financial Institutions

Joyo Bank, Tsukuba Bank, Mito Shinkin Bank, Yuuki Shinkin Bank, Ibaraki Prefectural Credit Union, Central Labor Bank, Hitachi Agricultural Cooperative Association

2. Japan Post Bank and Post Office (*yuucho, yuubinkyoku*)

Japan Post Bank and post office locations in the Kanto Region (includes Ibaraki Prefecture), and the Yamanashi Prefecture.

3. Convenience stores

Three-Eight, Seikatsu Saiya, Seiko Mart, Kurashi House, Seven-Eleven, Taiei, Daily Yamazaki, New Yamazaki Daily Store, Hasegawa Store, Hamanasu Club, FamilyMart, Popura, Mini Stop, Lawson, Lawson Store 100.

(Any store with an MMK (multifunctional ATM and payment service machine))

*Note:

Convenience stores cannot process payments in the following cases:

- Where the time limit for payment of a statement of payment has expired

- Items for which the amount per 1 payment slip exceeds 300,000 yen (with no barcode)

In these cases, please pay in person at a financial institution or Kasama City Hall.

Payment by automatic Account Transfer Payment (*kouza furikae*)

Please apply at the following financial institution counter.

If you are currently making an account transfer and wish to change or cancel your account, please do so at the counter of each financial institution.

1. Taxes that can be paid by automatic Account Transfer Payment (*kouza furikae*)
 - Fixed asset tax, light vehicle tax, municipal inhabitant tax (ordinary levy), National Health Insurance tax (ordinary levy)
2. Financial Institutions (that process automatic account transfers)
 - Joyo Bank, Tsukuba Bank, Mito Shinkin Bank, Yuuki Shinkin Bank, Ibaraki Prefectural Credit Union, Central Labor Bank, Hitachi Agricultural Cooperative, Japan Post Bank
3. What you need for the procedure
 - Deposit (savings) bankbook

- Personal Seal that you registered with your bankbook
 - Tax notice
4. The tax payment due date will be set as your account transfer withdrawal date.
- Payment via account transfer (*kouza furikae*) will begin from the month after you set up automatic transfers. (The Japan Post Bank will open two months later.)
 - Please pay Local (City) Taxes via normal payment options until your account transfer activates.
5. Notice of Account Transfer Payment
- A notification of payment is sent twice a year (March, September).
 - As for the light vehicle tax, we will send a notice of payment and a certificate of tax payment in June.
